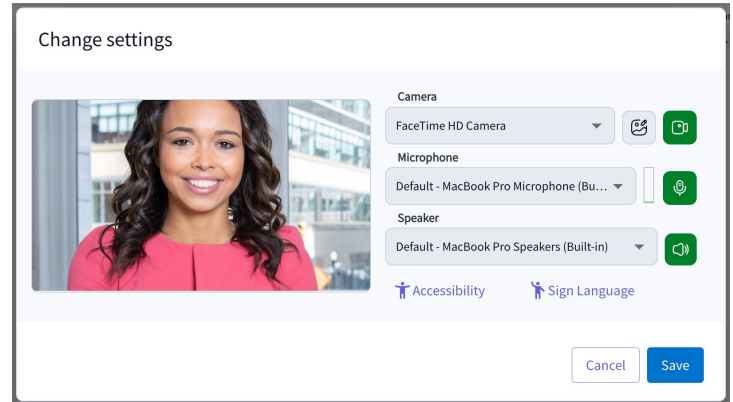


1. Use closed captions: Use Engageli's closed captioning feature to provide text-based captions for audio content. This can help participants with hearing impairments or those who prefer to read content rather than listen to it.
2. Provide transcripts: Provide transcripts of audio or video content to make it accessible to participants who are deaf or hard of hearing. This can also be helpful for participants who prefer to read content rather than listen to it. Turn on closed captions to create a transcript of your Engageli classroom recording that participants can read in a Playback Room.
3. Use high-contrast colors: Use high-contrast colors for text, graphics, and other visual elements to make them easier to read for participants with visual impairments.
4. Use alt text: Use alternative text (alt text) to describe images and other non-text content to make it accessible to participants who are blind or visually impaired.
5. Enable sign language video: Facilitators and participants who are deaf or hard of hearing can enable a sign language interpreter whose video can be highlighted in the Engageli classroom as needed.
6. Provide clear instructions in multiple modalities: Provide clear instructions for activities, assignments, and assessments in both written and verbal modes to ensure that all participants understand what is expected of them.
7. Use accessible technology: Encourage participants who need it to use accessible technology and software, such as screen readers and voice recognition software, to ensure that all participants can access and interact with content.
8. Use accessible formats: Use accessible formats, such as PDFs with text-based content, to make it easier for participants with disabilities to access and read the content.
9. Provide flexibility: Provide flexibility in how participants can access and engage with content. For example, allow participants to use assistive technology or provide alternative formats for content.

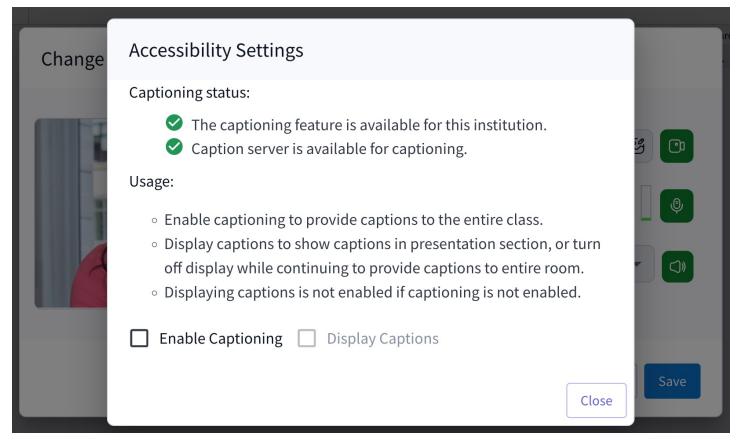

Accessibility Settings Within the Engageli Classroom

You can access Accessibility settings within the Engageli classroom by clicking the Gear icon on the bottom left side of the toolbar



Under Accessibility, you can enable closed captions. Remember, you must enable captioning first so that participants can enable captioning. Let participants know they can display captions for themselves by clicking the gear icon and checking the box for "Display Captions".



Under Sign Language, you can enable a Sign Language Video for an interpreter. The interpreter must have the "TA" role on the roster.
