

Engageli – Using Engageli Tags for Polls



Facilitators can use Engageli poll tags that can be added to any presentation slide or document outside of Engageli. The tags convert to clickable responses or answer fields that participants can respond to directly within the Engageli classroom.

Engageli Tags



Single choice: There are multiple options to choose from, but only one answer can be selected.



Multi choice poll

Multiple choice: There are multiple options to choose from, and you can select as many answers as you want.



TT Text poll

Text input: You can type a short response (up to 40 characters) and the answers will form a word cloud on the screen.



How to Create a Poll Using Engageli Tags

- 1. Open a Word doc or PowerPoint slide.
- 2. Choose if this is a single choice, multiple choice, or text input question.
- 3. Set up your slide or document with your question and answer choices, leaving room for the tags (QR codes).
- 4. Copy and paste the tag (QR code) into your slide or document depending on the response type you want for your poll. If creating a single or multiple choice poll, paste the tag as many times as desired answer choices (i.e. if you want 2 answer choices, paste the same tag two times.)
- 5. Save the file.

How to Use Your Created Poll in the Engageli Classroom

- 1. To start a quiz or poll, first make sure that you are in your Engageli classroom.
- 2. Share your screen with the document or slide containing the quiz or poll you want to
- 3. Click the Activate Tag (QR Code) button to start the poll or quiz.

You can share the results with your class by using the Share Results toggle. This allows participants to see the total number of selections for each answer choice. You can also see the number of participants who answered and did not answer the poll question. This is will not appear to learners when you share the results.

Pro Tip! Use poll responses to group participants for discussion. You can click the "Start Poll Split" to organize learners into tables based on common or diverse answers and have them discuss which answer they chose and why.
